The following are preliminary results for two random sample surveys of Oregon households conducted in May and June, 2007. One survey was administered to a statewide sample while the second survey was administered to rural counties only. The purpose of the survey was to examine attitudes and orientations toward K-12 and higher education in Oregon. Samples were purchased from *Survey Sampling Incorporated*. The response rate for the mail surveys is as follows (three waves of mailings):
