COMPLETION OF GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE STUDENT.

Total Credits: You must complete a minimum of 180 credits to graduate. At least 60 credits must be upper division (300 – 400 level).

Your Major: Major requirements can range in size from 45 to 72 credits, depending upon the major you select. Read the catalog and check with your department adviser for specific information regarding classes.

Baccalaureate Core: The Baccalaureate Core is the university's requirements for all majors. You must complete 48 credits in a variety of academic disciplines, outlined more fully on page 2. Classes from the major department may not be used for Baccalaureate Core.

Liberal Arts Core: In addition to the Baccalaureate Core, the College of Liberal Arts requires an additional 15 credits of liberal arts courses plus the B.A. (foreign language) or B.S. (math/science/computer science) option. Classes from the major department may not be used for Liberal Arts Core.

Electives: You must complete as many elective credits as necessary to bring your overall total to 180 credits. Electives, generally, are credit courses in any academic area. If you choose to develop a minor, those courses will also count as electives.

Limitations:

You may S/U 3 credits for every 12 credits taken at OSU. Maximum is 36 credits.

Physical Activity Courses (PAC) maximum is 11 credits.

Academic Learning Services (ALS) maximum is 15 credits.

Music (MUP) maximum is 12 credits.

45 of the last 75 credits must be from OSU.

MTH 111 and 245 (8 credits) C. Any 8 credits of MTH courses at the 200 level or above (not including MTH 211, 212, 390.) D. MTH 241 or 251, and ST 351 (8 credits). Economics majors. <p>Courses used to satisfy the B.S. requirements may not also be used to satisfy baccalaureate core requirements. Many departments require specific courses to satisfy this set of requirements, consult your academic adviser for details.</p>

IMPORTANT NOTE: No course may be used to meet more than one requirement. Courses from the major department **CAN NOT** be used to fulfill Baccalaureate Core or Liberal Arts Core requirements. Minor courses are the only exception. They can be used for requirements and minor.

GRADUATION IS NOT AUTOMATIC!! You must apply at least two terms prior to graduation.

Check when completed:

- () Baccalaureate Core completed.
- () College of Liberal Arts Core completed including requirements for the BA or BS.
- () Departmental requirements completed and major G.P.A. met and approved by departmental adviser.
- () Total credits equal a minimum of 180 (60 upper division).
- () Students must attain a minimum cumulative OSU G.P.A. of 2.00.
- () Application filed at least two terms prior to graduation. Applications are available in the Registrar's Office. Drop off completed form in the Registrar's Office.

SOME THINGS TO REMEMBER:

Remember! Consult your Departmental Adviser regularly!

Remember! You must maintain a 2.00 G.P.A. or above to remain in good academic standing with the University. (If you are experiencing academic difficulty, consult your adviser at once!)

Remember! If you're unsure about career direction, you should **1.** visit your academic adviser, **2.** take ALS 114 – Career Decision Making, **3.** visit the Career Services Office and, **4.** do an internship.

Remember! If you are thinking about graduate school, but do not know how to get started, schedule a visit with a major professor. He or she is an excellent source of information regarding the best schools in your particular area of study.
