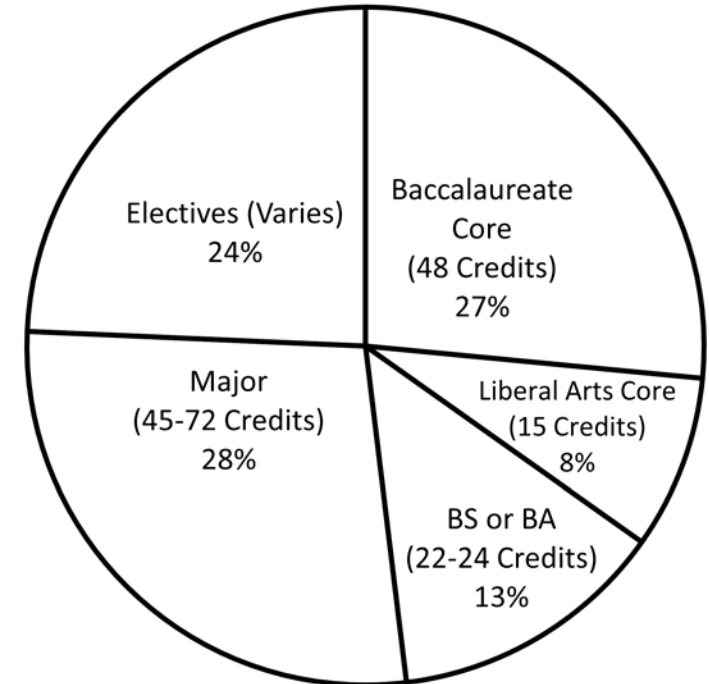

Many departments require specific courses to satisfy this set of requirements, consult your academic adviser for details.</p>

# GRADUATION CHECKLIST

**GRADUATION IS NOT AUTOMATIC!!** You must apply through student online services at least two terms prior to graduation.

Check when completed:

- ( ) Baccalaureate Core completed
- ( ) College of Liberal Arts Core completed including requirements for the BA or BS
- ( ) Departmental requirements completed and major G.P.A. met and approved by departmental adviser
- ( ) Total credits equal a minimum of 180
- ( ) Upper Division credits equal a minimum of 60
- ( ) Students must attain a minimum cumulative OSU G.P.A. of 2.00
- ( ) Application filed at least two terms prior to graduation. Applications are available in the Registrar's Office. Drop off completed form in the Registrar's Office

## SOME THINGS TO REMEMBER:

**Remember!** Consult your Departmental Advisor regularly!

**Remember!** You must maintain a 2.00 G.P.A. or above to remain in good academic standing with the University. (If you are experiencing academic difficulty, consult your advisor at once!) Visit the Academic Success Center for coaching, academic skills development, and writing support.

**Remember!** If you're unsure about career direction, you should **1.** visit your academic advisor, **2.** take ALS 114 – Career Decision Making, **3.** visit the Career Services Office and, **4.** do an internship.

**Remember!** If you are thinking about graduate school, but do not know how to get started, schedule a visit with a major professor. He or she is an excellent source of information regarding the best schools in your particular area of study.
