

## IIFET 2018 Seattle Best Paper Prizes

Each of our prizes has its own rules governing eligibility, permissible topics, rules, formatting, travel stipends, and prize funds; please click on the links below, and read all details carefully.

Please note the following rule applies to all prizes: Any eligible author may apply for ONE of the prizes listed below. (See the linked documents for eligibility rules, which differ.)

However, eligible students, if they choose to do so, may also apply for the Best Student Paper Prize, IN ADDITION TO any other single prize.

If a student is selected for both the Best Student Paper Prize and another prize, s/he will receive both prizes, but only one travel stipend to IIFET 2018. The second travel stipend may go to a runner-up.

All full papers are due by midnight Pacific Time April 4, 2018, by email to [Ann.L.Shriver@oregonstate.edu](mailto:Ann.L.Shriver@oregonstate.edu). Prize selections will be made and contestants informed of results by approximately May 2, 2018. In order to receive any prize or honorable mention, the prize winner must attend the conference and present the paper.

- **NEWEST!** Best Paper on Aquaculture Economics: We will offer two different types of prizes at IIFET 2018 Seattle.
  - IIFET Best Paper on Aquaculture Economics by any author on any aquaculture economics topic.
  - TWO AquaFish Best STUDENT Papers on Aquaculture Economics in developing countries. Authors may be students (or up to one year post graduation) from any country, but the topic must be related to aquaculture in developing countries.

- **NEW!** Rosemary Firth Award for Best Paper on the Economics of Gender in Fisheries and Aquaculture: This NEW prize aims to highlight the best quality paper applying economic analysis to address *gender issues, including gender inequality and/or inequity, in fisheries and/or aquaculture*. - **NEW!** EAFE Prize: This NEW prize provides a travel stipend to enable the student author to attend the EAFE conference in 2019, to present his/her prize-winning *interdisciplinary paper on a fishery management topic*.
