NAAFE Forum 2013, the seventh biennial conference of the North American Association of Fisheries Economics & Trade (NAAFE), was held at Tradewinds Island Grand Resort, St. Petersburg, Florida, USA May 21-24, 2013.

Organization

The Forum Organizing Committee was led by Sherry Larkin and Chuck Adams of the University of Florida. Sherry Larkin and NAAFE President Juan Carlos Seijo of the Universidad Marista de Merida co-chaired the scientific committee.

Participation

166 participants from 14 countries (US, Mexico. Canada, Japan, Vietnam, Australia, New Zealand, Norway, Sweden, Iceland, Denmark, Germany, Trinidad and Tobago) attended, representing academia, government, industry, and domestic and international agencies.







Innovations

NAAFE Forum 2013 saw the development of a new and innovative program which culminated in the development of a new prize competition: the Best Student Presentation. Forum organizers Adams and Larkin hosted an Auction/Raffle during the Forum's Banquet on Thursday, May 23rd. NAAFE members and others donated or solicited a variety of goods to contribute to the auction. Over \$6000 in funds raised provided a \$250 cash award for the Best Student Presentation, funded the publication of the Best Student Paper in Marine Resource Economics (MRE, NAAFE's affiliated journal), provided student subscriptions to the MRE journal and were available to pay publication charges in MRE for other student papers presented at the NAAFE Forum. Our goal in recognizing the Best Student Presentation was to provide guidance on the important attributes of effective presentation of research papers.

The contest was open to participation by all individuals currently enrolled in a graduate program (i.e., have not yet completed all requirements for the degree). Two judges attended each presentation.

Presentations were judged on the following criteria:

- 1. Quality of visual aids
- 2. Presentation style
- 3. Time management (i.e., success at covering all aspects of outline)
- 4. Study is well-motivated and results were well interpreted
