Description

This reading and conference covers the requirements for the master's of science offered by the XYZ Program. During the course we will establish mutually agreed upon weekly goals for completing the reading and conference and short term and long term goals for completing your degree.  - Assign Research Office CITI course.
- 7. Discuss research directions.
 - Discuss CITI course.
 - Select second article to review.
- 8. Discuss second journal article and request a written review of the article to be submitted before the next meeting.
- 9. Go over the written review from week 8.
- 10. Evaluate the Reading and Conference.
