The Raising Reser project is about expanding Beaver Nation, both in membership and in the form of a state-of-the-art venue designed to enhance your Beaver football experience for seasons to come. The current \$80 million renovation project will add many years to the life of Reser Stadium. Demand for access to Oregon State football is increasing, along with the desire for spectator amenities.

Reser Stadium must grow to accommodate a new generation of Beaver Nation with facilities that place a premium on comfort and convenience. Phase One of Raising Reser will have a seating capacity near 43,000 - giving nearly 8,000 more Beaver fans the chance to be a part of Oregon State Football.

The construction plan includes two future phases that would renovate the existing visitor's side to mirror the new home side and add a second deck to the south endzone to complete the bowl. These three phases would bring the total capacity of Reser Stadium to 55,000 seats. We don't have to be the biggest, we have to be the best...

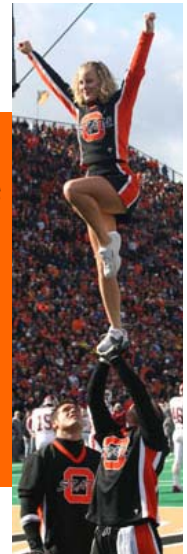
Partner Stunt and Tumbling Classes
