**ABSTRACTS:** Abstracts are required for all submitted papers, poster displays, and symposia presentations. First and second place prizes will be awarded for the best 10-minute oral presentations and posters in two categories, one for Masters and one for Ph.D. candidates. #### **AIRPORTS AND GROUND TRANSPORTATION:**

The conference location is conveniently located in the heart of Portland. For driving directions and maps please go to the hotel website <http://marriott.com/property/propertypage/PDXOR> and click on 'Maps & Transportation'. **Driving Directions from the Portland airport:** The Portland Marriot Downtown Waterfront Hotel is 9 miles from the airport. Take Airport Way East to I-205 South. Then take I-84 West to the City Center (City Center/Oregon City) exit, continue to follow signs to City Center. Cross Morrison Bridge and take Naito Parkway Exit and turn right. Hotel is 1/2 mile on right. **Other transportation from the Portland airport:** Blue Star Shuttle Service will take you for \$13 (one way) from the airport to the hotel. The shuttle leaves every half hour. MAX, Portland's light rail train, connects the airport with the downtown area and is the most economical way to get you near the hotel from the airport but you have to walk a little. Trains depart every 15 minutes. A one-way ticket costs \$2. Get off at 3<sup>rd</sup> and Morrison, about seven blocks from the hotel. Taxis cost \$30 one way from the airport to the hotel. **Driving directions from I-5 (northbound):** Take City Center/Naito Parkway Exit. Go through 2 stoplights; hotel is directly on right. **Parking:** On-site parking is available for \$23/day. Off-site parking lots and garages are also available close to the hotel and are \$9/day.

**WEATHER:** March weather in Portland can already be quite pleasant and spring-like but there still may be some rain. So bring your umbrella, just to be prepared. The March temperature ranges from a high of 56°F (13.3°C) to a low of 41°F (5°C).
