

### Timeline for Development of Student Affairs Assessment

Spring 1996	Student Affairs Campus Compact process identified assessment as one of 5 key initiatives for the SA Division
Spring 1996	Creation of Student Affairs Assessment Committee with charge from Vice Provost of Student Affairs
1997-1999	SA sends committee members to on-going assessment training conducted by NASPA
1997-1998	SA Assessment Committee created brochure outlining assessment practices for SA departments
May 1998	SA Assessment Committee proposed to VP for Student Affairs establishment of a Director for SA Assessment
February 1999	SA Assessment Committee creates and distributes best practices booklet for assessment in the Division
February 1999	SA Assessment Committee brings Dr. Gary Hansen, Assessment Director at U of Texas-Austin for one-day workshop for faculty and staff
April 2000	SA Assessment Committee creates 2 <sup>nd</sup> proposal for Director of Assessment for SA
May 2001	SA Assessment Committee hosts OSU Assessment Showcase—one-day on-campus conference presenting multiple methods and processes occurring on OSU campus
2001-present	SA administers university-wide surveys—CIRP, NSSE and distributes results on campus
August 2002	SA created Office of Student Affairs Research and Evaluation
October 2002	OSU 2007 Student Experience-Assessment Sub-Committee submits proposal for Assessment Office for OSU
November 2002	SA Assessment Web Site goes live <a href="http://oregonstate.edu/admin/student_affairs/research/res_introduction.html">http://oregonstate.edu/admin/student_affairs/research/res_introduction.html</a>
January 2003	SA publishes first edition of OSU Perspectives—quarterly newsletter for all OSU
March 2003	SA forms Student Affairs Assessment Council with new charge from Vice Provost for Student Affairs
October 2003	All SA departments developed and submitted assessment plans for review by consultant, Dr. Marilee Bresciani, Director of Assessment, North Carolina State University
November 2003	SA Assessment Council brings Dr. Bresciani to OSU for 2-day assessment workshops and consultation

November 2003 and for remainder of academic year	SA Assessment Council develops assessment learning agenda based upon consultant's feedback and continues to work with SA departments in further defining and developing assessment plans, methods, etc.
December 2003	SA Assessment Council adopts standard format and language for submission of Assessment Plans
December 2003	Release OSU results on 2003 NSSE and 2003 YFCY Surveys
January, 2004	Workshop 1—Assessment Planning—Mission/Goals—open to all SA departments
February, 2004	Participated in NSSE and over sampled students of color
February 2004	Release OSU results on 2003 FSSE pilot survey
February 2004	Workshop 2—Assessment Planning—Outcomes--open to all SA departments
March 2004	Workshop 3—Assessment Planning—Methods of Measurement—open to all SA departments
April 2004	Workshop 4—Assessment Planning—Use of Matrices and Rubrics
April 2004	Departmental Assessment Plans due—feedback provided via rubric
April 2004	SA sends a team of 12 to NC State Symposium and Invited half day seminar
May 2004	Work with Learning Agenda determined following NC State Symposium/set up summer agenda and fall training
Summer, 2004	Participate in the CIRP Freshman Survey-increased return rate to over 90%
September 2004	Reports of Assessment Plans and Use of Data to Inform Decisions Due in Annual Report
November 2004	OSU Symposium on Student Learning and Assessment—planned and hosted by the Student Affairs Assessment Council
December, 2004	Released 2004 NSSE results for OSU
January, 2005	Student Affairs Departments' Assessment Plans (with revisions if needed) are due to the Assessment Council
January, 2005	Student Affairs Assessment Council begins to review departmental assessment plans and provide feedback to departments and to the Council on the status of these plans
January, 2005	OSU Perspective published for Fall Quarter
February/March 2005	Workshops (4) on Assessment Methodology conducted in Student Affairs
February/May, 2005	Administration of the 2005 NSSE and the 2005 FSSE—College of Health and Human Sciences partners to over sample their students on the NSSE

June, 2005	First meeting of the University Assessment Council
June, 2005	Student Affairs Assessment Council Retreat—Purpose to develop division-wide learning goals and a structure for implementation
June-August, 2005	Administration of the 2005 CIRP at summer START
Fall, 2005	Director of Student Affairs Research and Evaluation begins interim position as Director of Institutional Research
October, 2005	Presentation of Student Affairs Division-wide learning goals by SA Assessment Council at the annual fall division meeting
January, 2006	Departmental Assessment Plans due to the SA Assessment Council for review (due annually)
Winter term, 2006	SA Assessment Council reviews plans and provides feedback to departments
Spring term, 2006	OSU selected to participate in the Multi-Institutional Study of Leadership sponsored by the University of Maryland—College Park
March, 2006	Released OSU results for 2005 NSSE

Summer, 2007	Survey (Entering Student Survey) developed by Student Affairs Assessment Council and collaborators from academic units administered to incoming first year students
June, 2007	Five members of the Student Affairs Assessment Council present half-day pre-conference workshop on Assessment Methods and Processes: Case Studies from a Division of Student Affairs at the 2007 NASPA International Assessment and Retention Conference, St. Louis, MO
June, 2007	Student Affairs Assessment Council Retreat: Development of a NEW Rubric for Assessing Assessment Plans and Reports and Reflection and Conversation about what we are learning and what we yet need to learn. Work groups established for Council projects for the year.
September, 2007	Student Affairs Departments/Unit may elect to have plans/reports reviewed in either September or January. September plans and reports due to the Student Affairs Assessment Council
