

OSU Sustainability Group Field Trips

- February 24, 2003: Fairview Training Center in Salem with Russ Beaton: site for proposed sustainable community.
- May 22 & 29, 2003: Steve Cook's house in Corvallis: gray water system, biodiesel furnace, chickens and strawbale chicken coop, plastic wood planters, vegetable and fruit gardens.
- June 18, 2003: Jonathan Carroll's house in Corvallis: solar panels, on-demand water heater, composting toilet, skylight tubes, LED light bulbs, solar space heater, chickens, vegetable and fruit gardens.
- July 15, 2003: Intaba's Kitchen Restaurant in Corvallis with artist and designer, Kiko Denzer: Cob walls and oven.
- August 11, 2003: OSU Organic Grower's Farm near Trysting Tree Golf Course off Highway 34.
- January 14, 2004: Tour of Weatherford Hall, OSU's oldest residence hall, with Logan Cravens of SERA Architects and Daniel Pelissier, LEED Certified Professional with Howard Wright Construction. Weatherford Hall underwent a \$17.5 million renovation and opened in Fall 2004.
- April 2, 2004: Tour of U of O's Lillis Business Complex, designed to maximize energy efficiency and slash power bills, to minimize negative environmental impacts, and to set new standards for environmentally-friendly design, serving as a case study in sustainability.
- August 12, 2004: Tour of Charlyn Ellis and Mark Boyd's household graywater system.

- March 31, 2005: Field trip to First Alternative Co-op's South store to see their new solar panel array. Discussion with Jonathan Carroll, the manager of the North store. Similar systems are also on the North store and Lincoln School.
- May 24, 2005: Field trip to Jonathan Carroll's house to see his photovoltaic system, biodiesel collection and manufacturing system, on-demand water heater, light tubes, and other energy-saving devices.
- August 24, 2005: Field trip to Your Green Home Store to check out the latest in non-toxic paints, stains, floor covering, insulation, bedding, etc.
- February 15, 2006: Tour of Sequential Biofuel's new plant in Salem with Tomas Endicott. Organized by the OSU Biodiesel Initiative.
- June 13, 2006: Tour of Charlie Miller and Martha Clemens' residential solar system.
- June 7, 2007: Field trip to Jonathan Carroll and Brandon Trelstad's homes to look at their solar photo voltaic and hot water systems, etc.
- July 9, 2007: Field trip to BRING Recycling (tour given by Julie Daniel), Sequential Biofuels, and Aurora Glass in Eugene with the Master Recyclers.

July 26, 2007: Field trip to Pringle Creek Sustainable Community in Salem (the old Fairview Training Site). James Santana gave us a tour of the site.

August 27, 2007: Tour of Coho Ecovillage in Corvallis with Bruce Hecht, the manager of the project. Coho Ecovillage is a 34-unit cohousing community, due to be finished in early October, 2007.
